Wittliff photographed fiestas, religious observances, street scenes, people's faces, and enduring rural landscapes. The accompanying essays by Harrigan and Elizabeth Ferrer discuss the history and techniques of pinhole photography, as well as Bill Wittliff's artistic choice to work in this medium.
